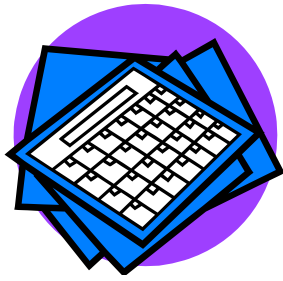

Vaughan Elementary School Programs and Procedures

I. PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

A. The North Carolina Standard Course of Study, developed by the North Carolina Department of public Instruction, specifies the curriculum for public schools to use in teaching all students. This curriculum for K-5 includes arts education, communication skills, guidance, healthful living, information and computer skills, mathematics, science, second language, and social studies. All students are expected to participate in extra-curricular and non-academic activities to the best of their abilities. The following programs are also offered to further promote the academic success of students.

B. Student Health Services

1. Itinerant elementary school nurse
2. Support from the Warren County Health Department and other agencies

C. Breakfast and Lunch Programs

The cafeteria prepares a good nutritional breakfast and lunch each day. Children are encouraged to eat their meals completely.

The free or reduced price lunch program is available. Your family will receive an application from the Warren County Schools Child Nutrition program. Meal status and number will be assigned as the application is processed.

II. SCHOOL SUPPLIES

Parents should provide students with the necessary supplies for completing school assignments. Supplies may consist of paper, composition books, pencils, glue sticks, and crayons. Teachers will provide a list of needed supplies at the beginning of the year. The supply list will also be posted on the Vaughan School website. Each student should have a backpack/book bag to transport schoolwork and books. **Please put your child's name on all of his/her possessions.**

III. INFORMATION REGARDING STUDENTS

- A. The law states that we cannot allow any student to attend school for more than thirty (30) calendar days without receiving written certification that the student is properly immunized. The student will be suspended from school if no certificate is furnished or the child has not started taking immunization sequences after the thirty (30) days grace period.

All kindergarten students must have a KINDERGARTEN HEALTH ASSESSMENT REPORT. The law states that we cannot allow any student to attend school for more than thirty (30) calendar days without receiving the assessment.

- B. **Grading** - There will be four (4) different grade reports issued at Vaughan Elementary School: Kindergarten, Grades 1, Grade 2, and Grade 3-5. Report Cards will be issued at the end of every nine weeks. Progress Reports will be issued between grading periods. If you do not understand the grade your child received, please contact your child's teacher. Letters will be sent to parents if problems exist concerning academic achievement, conduct, or attendance. If you receive a notification of concern, please contact the school. There will be two (2) regular conference times during the school year. Please refer to Warren County School's calendar (Parent-Teacher Conference Days).
- C. **School Fees** - Damaged or lost textbook fees are charged only to students who have lost or damaged their books beyond the normal wear and tear expected during the school year. The media specialist will send notification of lost or damaged library books with the appropriate charge.
- D. **Student School Insurance** - School insurance is an option but it is available to all students upon request. All registration and filing information is handled by the parent.
- E. **Attendance** - Every parent or guardian of Vaughan Elementary School is responsible for their child being on time in school every day. Arrival time for students is between 8:00 a.m. and 8:15 a.m. The instructional day begins at 8:30 a.m. and ends at 2:50 p.m. Any child arriving after 8:30 a.m. are recorded as tardy. Such students must report to the office and sign in upon arrival. Tardiness disrupts instruction. A student must be present at least one-half of the school instructional day in order to be recorded present for the day. Eleven-thirty (11:30) is one-half of the school day.

Make-up work - Students are responsible for all work missed when absent from school. Immediately upon returning to school, a student must make arrangements with his/her teacher(s) to make up all missed assignments and test(s).

F. Student Permission to Leave the Campus - When it is necessary for a child to be dismissed early from his/her daily schedule, the parent must visit the office and sign that child out. Please do not go directly to the classroom. We will not release any student to anyone other than parents or legal guardians without permission.

G. Telephone - Messages for students will be taken by the office when there is an emergency or when it is essential for a student to receive information. Students are not usually called to the phone. Since office telephones are constantly in use for school business, students will not be allowed to call home. In case of an emergency, the school office will contact you.

H. Personal Hygiene and Dress - Student dress must follow the school dress code and grooming must be neat, clean, and in good taste so that each student shares in a positive, healthy, and safe environment at school. Good personal hygiene shall be stressed at all times by school personnel. Please refer to the dress code policy for proper school uniform attire.

I. Unacceptable Items at School - The only time students should bring toys, games, etc. to school is when their teacher instructs them to do so (Show and Tell). The students will assume responsibility for any items brought to school. Items specifically not to be brought include electronic handheld games (Nintendo DS, PSP, etc.) radios, cameras, tape recorders, mechanical toys, Ipods, cell phones, MP3 players, or other equipment. Such belongings can be lost or broken at school. If one of these items is brought to school it will be secured by the teacher and kept in the office for the remainder of the school year. We appreciate your help in keeping toys and electronic equipment at home.

J. Health Room/Medications - It is important that your child remain healthy in order to be successful. If a child has a temperature of 100 or above, he/she will not be allowed to stay in the health room. A parent will be called to come and pick up the student. We can not properly monitor a student who is sick for a whole day. It is important that you have an emergency person other than yourself on file in the office in case you cannot be reached. School personnel may only administer drugs or medications prescribed by a doctor. The Request For Medication To Be Given During School Hours Form, must be completed and signed **by the doctor** before any drug or medication may be given at school. All medication must be brought to school in the original bottle by a parent or guardian. Students should not transport medication on the bus.

K. School Closing - School closing, because of inclement weather, will be announced on major radio and TV Stations. Unscheduled closing due to weather or equipment failure may also occur. Each child should know where to go if an emergency arises and school is dismissed early. A ConnectEd call will inform you of such an emergency. Please make sure that the school has your updated telephone numbers at all times.

L. Student Achievement/Homework/Reading - Each student is responsible for doing his/her homework. During the first week of the school year, you will receive a letter from your child's teacher outlining expectations and responsibilities concerning homework assignments, readings, and projects. As parents it is your responsibility to check with your child concerning his/her homework assignments. Each student is expected to complete assignments and bring them to school when due. Each student is expected to read at home every day. There is a direct correlation between a child's achievement, homework, and daily reading. READERS ARE ACHIEVERS!

IV. SCHOOL BUS SAFETY & RULES

Safe school bus transportation is an integral part of the total educational plan. It is our responsibility to provide a continuing, well-planned, and effective school bus safety program. The safety of the students transported to and from school is a responsibility shared equally by passengers, classroom teachers, school bus drivers, school administrators, parents, and the motoring public.

School bus safety rules are designed specifically for the safety and well-being of all school bus passengers. Repeated violations may result in one or more days suspension from riding the bus.

Please read the following rules carefully;

1. Watch for the school bus every morning.
2. Stand in the driveway while waiting for the bus.
3. Watch for the traffic before crossing the street.
4. Do not stop and pick up a dropped object, unless you tell the bus driver first. A monitor should watch you while you are picking up what you dropped.
5. Hold the handrail while boarding and unloading the bus.
6. Watch for traffic when leaving the bus.
7. Use the backdoor only for an emergency.
8. Never push or shove anyone while boarding and unloading the bus.
9. Sit quietly in your seat while riding the bus. Loud talking or yelling will not be acceptable behavior. No standing or changing seats will be allowed.
10. Keep hands, feet, and objects to yourself.
11. Fighting and throwing objects will not be tolerated. These will be considered a serious offense.

12. Cursing and profanity will not be tolerated.
13. Students will not play on the bus.
14. Keep the aisle clear at all times.
15. Obey the bus driver. He/she is responsible for your safety.

V. SCHOOL BUS ASSIGNMENTS

For safety purposes this year all bus changes must be put in writing and given to the school secretary. The note must contain the bus number and the address at which the child will get off the bus along with the parent's signature.

No phone messages will be taken for bus changes. Please remind your child to give the note to the secretary as soon as they arrive on campus. The secretary will copy the note and give one to the teacher and the bus driver.

Any other change in your child's regular pick-up or bus schedule must be done through the office **before 2:00 p.m.** Thank you for your cooperation in helping to keep our students safe at Vaughan School.

VI. DISCIPLINE

Maintaining a safe and orderly environment with good discipline in our school is essential for teaching and learning to occur. It is important to have full parental cooperation and support for our school discipline policy to be effective. Safety Patrol members assist in helping to maintain a safe and orderly environment. Students should respect and listen to members.

The following statements best describe the philosophy projected by the staff of Vaughan Elementary School:

1. Both children and staff will respect others and expect to be respected.
2. Children will take advantage of the opportunity to learn and will allow others the same opportunity.
3. All who come to Vaughan Elementary School will leave the buildings and grounds as nice, or nicer, as they were when they arrived.
4. No student will keep a teacher from teaching nor another student from learning.

Teachers will be responsible for enforcing the rules; however, students may be suspended one or more days depending on the severity of the action for stealing, fighting, vandalizing, or repeated disruptive behavior.. Suspension for bringing weapons or drugs to school will follow regulations found in Warren County School's Policy Manual. Parents/Guardians will be notified to come to school for a conference.

We encourage parents to review the following rules at home with the students:

- A. Classroom Behavior: Students will
 - 1. follow rules and consequences established in each classroom
 - 2. follow directions and complete work.

- B. Hall and Sidewalk Behavior: Students will
 - 1. walk quietly in halls, on sidewalks, and to and from the buses.

- C. Restrooms or toilets: Students will
 - 1. use stalls privately
 - 2. flush commodes/urinals
 - 3. wash hands, turn off water, and use one towel
 - 4. leave area immediately after taking care of needs.

- D. Playground Behavior: Students will
 - 1. follow all established rules for the playground .

- E. Cafeteria: Students will
 - 1. use a quiet voice
 - 2. use good table manners and not play with food
 - 3. clean up spills
 - 4. eat food while in the cafeteria
 - 5. leave uneaten food in the cafeteria
 - (6. refrain from bringing soft drinks to school.

The principal of your child's school is committed to providing a safe and orderly environment that is conducive to learning. As the instructional leader of the school, he/she will support the teachers in their efforts to teach all students. Opportunities for the establishment and attainment of high expectations will be made available to all students.

1. Colors - District-wide colors for uniform bottoms (pants, skirts, and shorts) will be *khaki tan, black and navy blue*. The district-wide top color will be *black, white or light blue* with a collar. These colors may be worn at all schools. Each school may choose *one* additional color for uniform tops their students. Dresses must have sleeves and a collar or have an approved top underneath. Dresses can be *khaki tan, navy blue, black, white, light blue or the approved school color*. Identified colors should be stated specifically (ex. royal blue) so that students are not confused by the colors. *See also Table I District and School Color chart on page 4.*
2. Basic Uniform - The basic uniform shall be pants, skirt or jumper and long sleeve or short sleeve shirt with a collar (polo style, dress style, or turtleneck). Students can wear any combination of the official colors.
 - A. Pants must be straight-legged or boot cut in good condition without holes or tears. Full-length pants, cropped pants, cargo pants and straight-legged capri pants are permitted. Denim jeans and bell bottoms are not permitted.
 - B. Walking shorts are permitted. (Walking shorts are straight-legged shorts that are no more than three inches above the knee.)
 - C. Coveralls and overalls are prohibited.
 - D. Pants must fit at the waist and not be oversized or undersized (e.g., Baggy pants, sagging pants, tights, or pants made of spandex are prohibited.). If belts are worn they must be fitted and put through belt loops. If the pants or the garment has belt loops, the student must wear a belt. Belts must be solid brown, black, tan, white or navy blue in color. *See Table I.* Belt buckles must be a standard size without insignias, emblems or symbols. Over-sized belt buckles are prohibited.
 - E. Skirts or jumpers must not be more than three inches above the knee.
 - F. Shirts must be tucked on the inside of pants.
 - G. T-shirts may be worn as undergarments. They must be solid white or one of the additional colors approved for the school. School-issued T-shirts (with the school logo on it) may also be worn over approved color shirts.
 - H. Light jackets, vests, sweaters, sweatshirts without hoods, blazers and cardigans are permitted as items that may be worn over the uniform top. They must be solid and one of the following approved colors: khaki tan, navy blue, black, white, light blue or the school designated color. *See Table J. I.* No denim material may be worn as uniform clothing.
 - J. All uniform clothing must be plain without any manufacturer's logos, brand names, pictures, or insignias visible on the clothing. A school logo on clothing is permitted.
 - K. Socks, tights and hose colors are solid white, navy blue, brown, black or the designated school color. (Hose may also be flesh tone) *See Table I. Tights must cover the toe.*
 - L. Neckties can be worn but must be solid black, navy blue or the designated school color. *See Table I.*
 - M. Headgear (including hats, scarves, hoods and du-rags) shall not be worn in the school building.

- N. Shoes should be solid white, brown, tan, black or navy blue. *See Table I.* Shoes can have heels no higher than one and one-half inches. Shoes with rollers/wheels and flip-flops are prohibited. Sneakers, sandals with straps on the heel, and boots are permitted. Shoestrings must be the same approved color as the shoe.
- O. Heavy coats, heavy jackets and raincoats are not covered by these regulations and are not to be worn during the school day unless permitted by the principal for special circumstances.
- P. Midriffs and cleavage shall be covered. All undergarments shall also be covered at all times.
3. The district prohibits Pre-K-12 students from wearing any type of clothing, apparel or accessory that denotes their membership in or affiliation with a gang. Therefore, principals shall have the authority to place restrictions on the Basic Uniform for safety reasons including gang-related activity.
 4. Students may wear the uniforms of nationally-recognized student organizations or the uniform of other school organizations at the schools on days specified by the organization (e.g., Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, JROTC).
 5. The school district and local schools must inform parents of the availability of assistance if they cannot afford to purchase school uniforms at competitive prices.
 6. Violation of the school uniform policy shall not directly affect a student's academic or conduct grade.
 7. Parent concerns about the school uniform policy and the school dress code shall be reported to the principal.
 8. The Exceptional Children Department must decide whether any student(s) should be exempt from the School Uniforms Policy due to a student's exceptionality.
 9. The school uniform policy shall be in effect during both the school year and the summer program and at times when students are involved in Warren County Schools' sponsored events.

COMPLIANCE

Schools may use the following strategies and disciplinary measures for violations of the School Uniforms and Dress Codes policy.

Principals are responsible for the enforcement of the dress code. A student who is not in compliance with this policy or a school dress code shall be given a reasonable period of time to make adjustments so that he or she will be in compliance. Failure to comply may result in the student being removed from school until his or her appearance or clothing meets school system policy or rules. The student's parent or guardian shall be notified prior to any such removal. (*See items 1-5 below*)

If necessary, disciplinary action may be taken to encourage compliance with the policy. Noncompliance could result in suspension or expulsion. Refer to the Student Code of Conduct.

A student who is not in compliance with the uniform dress code will be disciplined in the following manner:

1. The first infraction will involve parent contact by phone and a letter describing how the student was not in compliance with the policy. The parent will be asked to bring appropriate clothing to place the student within compliance immediately.
2. The second infraction will involve a parent meeting and the student will be sent home for the remainder of the school day.
3. The third infraction will result in the student receiving a 3-day suspension from school.
4. The fourth infraction will result in the student receiving a 5-day suspension from school.
5. The fifth infraction will result in the student receiving a 10-day suspension from school.
6. The sixth infraction will result in the student receiving a recommendation for long-term suspension for noncompliance and insubordination.

EXEMPTIONS

A. Request for Exemption and Appeals

A parent who objects to the school uniform because of his or her religion, religious belief or because of a medical condition of the student must obtain a copy of the policy on School Uniforms and Dress Codes, a Request for Exemption form and an Exemption Questionnaire from the school, complete the form and questionnaire, and return them to the school. The principal shall review the form and questionnaire and accept or deny the request for exemption. If the principal is considering denying the request, he or she must first send a letter to the parent requesting a meeting to discuss and clarify the reason for the exemption request. The parent must meet with the principal within three school days of receiving the letter. The principal must accept or deny the request within two school days of meeting with the parent. If the principal denies the request, he or she must give the parent a written basis for the decision. The parent can appeal a principal's denial of the request for exemption to the Superintendent (or designee) by following the Warren County Schools Appeals Process.

- B. A religious exemption can be based on the religion of the parent or the religion of the child, but the parent must apply for the exemption in either case.

C. Example of an Exemption Request

Mr. Smith requests an exemption for his daughter. He states that he is a member of a particular faith, and his religion requires women to cover their heads and all parts of their bodies except their face, hands, and feet when in public. Mr. Smith believes that wearing the traditional dress style of his faith will allow his child to fulfill these requirements. He believes that the school uniform is not sufficient to meet the requirements set forth by his faith.

In this example, the parent identified his religion and one of its beliefs or tenets and indicated how he believed wearing the school uniform conflicts with one of his religion's beliefs.
